

Create a Safety Poster

Instructions

Use one of the templates provided to design a safety poster. These can be designs that demonstrate a safe practice, highlight a safety phrase/catchy reminder, or show an example of what NOT to do!

To Print

1. Best printed on 8.5 x 11 (standard letter sized) paper
2. Use “auto color” to allow for true colors to be printed
3. Portrait orientation

Theme / Content Options

** You don't have to use topics from this list! Use any safety topic that is relevant to you! **

- ◆ Knife safety (safe cutting practices)
- ◆ Safe lifting (bend your knees, don't use your back!)
- ◆ Your three workplace rights (the right to know about dangers in the workplace, the right to refuse unusually dangerous work, the right to participate in health and safety activities)
- ◆ If you don't know how to do something safely, **STOP & ASK** for help!
- ◆ Personal protective equipment (boots, gloves, goggles, hearing protection)
- ◆ Slip, trip and fall prevention! (clean up spills, wear appropriate footwear, etc.)
- ◆ Winter / Summer / Outdoor safety (winter—cold, ice; summer—sunburn, insects, etc.)

Optional Modifications

- ◆ Have participants work together in small groups, this will facilitate discussion around at least one safety topic.
- ◆ Lead a group discussion following the creation of the posters.

Discussion Questions

- ◆ Why did you decide to create the poster you did? Does it have any personal significance?
- ◆ Who do you think would benefit from seeing your poster? How might it change their behavior?
