

Safety Statistics



- Over 45% of young workers experience a workplace injury.
-Stats Canada
- Youth (ages 15-24) are three times more likely to be injured on the job than any other worker. -WCB Saskatchewan
- About 3,500 people under the age of 25 are injured on the job in Saskatchewan each year and three will die from a work-related incident.-WorkSafe
- Over 70% of youth or new hires get injured at their first job in the service and hospitality industries. -Stats Canada
- In 2015, many of the injured young workers aged 15 to 19 years old were food counter attendants and kitchen helpers. Many of the injured young workers aged 20 to 24 years old were labourers in processing, manufacturing and utilities.- Ministry of Labour
- Young people ages 12 to 19 had the highest likelihood of injury. More than one-quarter (27%) of this age group suffered an injury, almost twice the proportion of adults (14%) and three times the proportion of seniors (9%). - Stats Canada
- Falls were the leading cause of injury. About 63% of seniors and one-half of adolescents were injured in falls, as were 35% of working-age adults. -Stats Canada
