Saskatchewan is the home of multiple strategies and safety organizations that aim to raise awareness about the importance of workplace safety.

All workers have 3 rights:

- 1.) The right to **know** about hazards in the workplace.
- 2.) The right to **participate** in health and safety activities in the workplace.
- 3.) The right to **refuse** unusually dangerous work.

1. Service Hospitality is a non-profit safety association funded by employers in the hotel, restaurant, laundry and community services industries. We are committed to providing valuable consultation and education services. Our resources and tools are delivered in a variety of learning methods to help keep your employees healthy and safe. Formed in 2002 out of a need to reduce the number of workplace injuries and fatalities, the partners work through an integrated provincial injury prevention strategy to deliver programs that move Saskatchewan towards zero workplace injuries.
